
TAG Accessibility Document

<u>Campus Paths</u>: Much of campus is made up of brick rather than concrete pathways. We intend to supply a van for those who need assistance getting around campus and will make that information available as soon as possible.

Hearth Memorial to the Enslaved: The brick paths around the memorial are flat and there are curbs cut to allow ease of movement.

Washington Hall: The ADA entry to Washington is accessible from the back of the building and easiest to arrive at from the ramp nearest the Hearth Memorial into the courtyard just behind the hall. It is on the west side of the hall and leads into the basement where there is an elevator and just beyond the elevator the Anthropology department proper.

Ewell Hall: The entrance ramp is on the West side of the building and leads into the performance hall. Through its doors you can access the hall with the elevator to the Graduate Lounge where the luncheon is being held. There will be signs guiding you through the building.



Arts Quarter: This complex is home to the theater where our keynote will take place. Entry is on the ground floor and there are plenty of opportunities for wheelchair seating on the main level therein. There are multiple elevators in the building with classroom spaces on the ground and second floors. There are no stairs to enter the building from the front entrance and the paths nearest it are concrete rather than brick. We suggest that everyone enter from there. Parking is available in the lot to the front and west of the building, but again we will have a van to take those who need assistance getting from Historic Campus to the Arts Quarter.

<u>Muscarelle Museum:</u> The entrance is without stairs and the Reception is held on the ground floor.
